PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. MUSIC This year we will be using Red Fridge Door to upload the music. You will be given instructions on how to do this and it can be done at the time of entering. Please ensure you bring back up music on a USB stick or a phone. (as a single track for each dance) Music needs to be uploaded by July 1st.
- 2. Under 12 years, dances should be no longer than THREE minutes; and no longer than FOUR minutes for dancers 12 years and over. Teams up to SIX minutes.
- 3. NOVICE applies to a competitor who has not won first place in any Novice, Restricted or Open class of that genre, entered at this or any other competition. If a class in any competition is not labelled as Novice or Restricted then it counts as Open. Students cannot go back into Novice when moving up an age group. A 'Novice' competitor may choose to dance in the open or the novice but not both. Once a competitor

A 'Novice' competitor may choose to dance in the open or the novice but not both. Once a competitor has won a novice they are only eligible to enter the open.

- 4. Championship Classes are only eligible to any competitor who has won an **Open Classical or Open Jazz** Class in any competition (You may repeat your solo). You must compete in at least TWO other classes relevant to that Championship Class at these competitions, ie Classical Solo compulsory, then 2 other classes (marked **) from the Classical Section. These **dances (with the exception of Classical Pointe) cannot be danced in the Championship. For ModernJazz, the MJ Solo is compulsory, as well as 2 other classes from the Modern Jazz Section (marked**).
- 5. A class may amalgamate if less than 3 entries received. The Committee reserves the right to amalgamate or split classes where necessary.
- 6. Duos and Pas de Deux may be danced with different partners. A dancer may only dance twice in a duo/trio class but it must be with a different partner.
- 7. Champion of Champions nominees will be selected by the adjudicator. Up to 10 nominees may be selected.
- Boys Classical Dance Class 110 must be a different dance to that in Open or Novice Classical Section, but can repeat in the Championship if eligible.
 Boys Modern Any Dance Under 12 Class 208 must be a different dance to any dance in Open or Novice M/L

Boys Modern Any Dance Under 12 Class 208 must be a different dance to any dance in Open or Novice M/J Section but can be repeated in the Championship if eligible.

- 9. Senior Variation competitors must enter both Section A & Section B to be eligible for the overall placing. 14 year olds may choose to enter in either Senior or Junior Variation Class but not both.
- 10. Only Ballet &/or Modern Jazz <u>No Tap</u> to be danced in any class in these competitions.
- 11. Class 304 and 304a Student Choreography Class must be presented as a student's own original work.
- 12. Original Choreography means not a Variation, or copied from another source such as YouTube.
- 13. Class 301 is for **Under 7 dancers.** (An opportunity for the little ones to dance any appropriate Solo dance from the Ballet/Modern Jazz syllabus)
- 14. Impromptu Dress Code must be adhered to; otherwise competitor may be disqualified. Plain dark colour, ie black, maroon or navy (minimal decorations or lace at the discretion of officials) no jewellery or hair accessories. Hair in bun or ponytail please read the Impromptu class carefully.
- 15. Classical Barefoot Classes please note **no footwear whatsoever** to be worn in Classical Barefoot classes.
- 16. The only classes where a dance may be repeated are Under 7, PACANZ nominations and Championships.
- 17. The Committee reserves the right to split large classes into smaller classes based on age.
- 18. The age of the competitor is the age they are on 20^{th} June 2023.
- 19. All entries are on-line using Red Fridge Door. Please see details on P 14

NATIONAL YOUNG PERFORMER AWARDS 2023 CRITERIA FOR MODERN DANCE

- 1. Competitors shall be 15 and under 21 years as at 1st October 2023.
- 2. Each competitor shall perform in three classes during the preliminary round:
 - 1. Modern/Jazz
 - 2. Contemporary
 - 3. Master Class run by the Adjudicators. No audience observation.
- 3. There shall be a maximum time limit of 3 1/2 minutes for each dance, taken from the beginning to the conclusion of the music.
- 4. There will be a semi-final at which competitors will repeat either B. 1 or B. 2 at the discretion of the adjudicators. Competitors will be chosen based on their marks in the Preliminary round(s). The number of semi-finalists will be decided in accordance with the NYPA rules.
- 5. For the Final Award Concert six competitors will be recalled and shall repeat the item not performed at the semi- final.
- 6. Costumes, choreography & music should be appropriate to the age of the competitors and suitable for a family audience this will be at the Adjudicators' discretion.

NB. Nomination of competitors by Societies should be based on classes B1 and B2 i.e. with or without the Master Class, but may include an impromptu class, at the discretion of the society.

NB: FOR THE NATIONAL COMPETITION

Nominees do NOT need to perform the same dances they used to win a Nomination. Nominees in the Modern Dance section are required to upload performance copies of their music when submitting their entry form, and a list of the titles and composer and/or artists for each piece. They must bring the same music on USB to registration. No changes are permitted after the 8th Sept 2023

SOCIETY NOMINATION

Each Society, which is a financial member of PACANZ, may nominate up to two competitors, who shall be selected by the adjudicator, based on Criteria stated in A, B and C.

The adjudicator will determine that a competitor has displayed a sufficient standard of performance to competently represent that society at the National Young Performer Awards.

The standard required will be at the absolute discretion of the adjudicator but will include:

- A demonstration of adequate preparation
- An authority of performance
- A performance with a level of maturity commensurate with a national final competition of this age group.

If the adjudicator considers that sufficient standard has NOT been reached by any competitor, then NO nomination will be made.

The Nominating Society is responsible for paying part of the entry fee to the National Young Performer Awards, which is \$75.00 incl gst.

The Nominee is responsible for paying their portion of the entry fee to the National Young Performer Awards, which is \$175.00 incl gst.



NATIONAL YOUNG PERFORMER AWARDS 2023 CRITERIA FOR TROUPES

1. Competitors will be under

Competitors may compete in . The ONLY exception is when they perform in their Studio Troupe AND for their Primary School/High School/Educational Institution. In order to represent a Studio or School, the Dancer MUST be a registered (fee paying) Student of the Organisation.

- 2. Each Troupe will be nominated at a Member Society Competition by performing in any dance genre pertinent to the Competition they enter. This competition is for amateur troupes only and is not open to professionals*.
- 3. There will be a maximum time limit of 4 1/2 minutes, taken from the beginning to the conclusion of the music.
- 4. Troupes who gain nomination **must** be able to attend the National Young Performer Competition which will be held in Palmerston North. Compulsory Registration/Orientation will be on Thursday 19th October and the Competition will be on Friday 20th October 2023.
- 5. A Final will be held on the afternoon/evening of Friday 20th October, with up to **18 Troupes** recalled to perform. The number of Troupes in the Final may change, at the discretion of the Adjudicator(s)
- 6. It MAY be possible for the top 3 Troupes to perform at the Soloist Final Award Concert on the evening of Sunday 22nd October 2023.
- 7. Costumes, choreography & music should be appropriate to the age of both the competitors and suitable for a family audience.

ADDITIONAL RULES

A. Once a Troupe Item has received a Nomination, it is no longer eligible to enter another Nomination class.

The Studio name, the Item name and the genre of the nominated item will be published on the PACANZ website as soon as PACANZ is notified by

the nominating Society.

C. The Item receiving a Nomination and submitted in the Video file following nomination, will be **substantially** the same Item when it is performed at the National Young Performer Awards on 20th October 2023. The genre and theme will be the same with **minor** alterations allowed in music, choreography, dancer number and costuming.

Troupe nominations are subject to challenge and a Troupe risks disqualifying themselves, if the above criteria are not adhered to.

ONE nominated Troupe only

The Dancers in the Nominated Troupe cannot perform in an additional Troupe to assist gaining a nomination

B. The Nominating Troupe will be required to complete the entire Entry process, via the APP,

within 14 days of receiving a Nomination. The Entry process will include uploading a Video file

of the Nominated Troupe item. Video footage taken at the Competition where the Nomination

was awarded would be most appropriate. If clarity is required in regards to any minor changes, please contact the PACANZ Office PRIOR to making the changes.

NB.

The **CLOSING DATES** will be relative to the date of Nomination. Troupe members' names and ages, the Item name and genre & entry fee will need to be submitted on the Official Entry by the closing date. The Video file will also need to be uploaded as part of the Entry process.

Nominees in the Troupe section are required to upload performance copies of their music in MP3 format when submitting their entry, and a list of the titles and composer and/or artists for each piece. They must bring the same music on USB to registration.

Music files are allowed MINOR changes between the time of entering and the NYPA competition. The FINAL DATE for submitting MINOR music changes ONLY, is 8th October 2023.

SOCIETY NOMINATION

Each Society, which is a financial member of PACANZ, may nominate **ONE Troupe****, who shall be selected by the adjudicator, based on a performance at the Member Society Competition.

The adjudicator will determine that the Troupe has displayed a sufficient standard of performance to competently represent that society at the National Troupe Finals.

The standard required will be at the absolute discretion of the adjudicator but will include:

- A demonstration of adequate preparation
- An authority of performance
- A performance with a level of expertise commensurate with a national final competition.

If the adjudicator considers that sufficient standard has **NOT** been reached by any Troupe, then **NO** nomination will be made.

The nominated Troupe is responsible for paying the entry fee to the National Young Performer Awards, which is **\$250.00 incl gst.**

* A professional is someone whose primary employment is being paid to perform or work in the performing arts. For the present purposes, being a student constitutes "primary employment" and therefore is not seen as a Professional. For the Student who receives payment for participation, either teaching or performing, this should not impose professional status on a person if it is by way only of an occasional bonus or benefit rather than their principal means of earning a livelihood.

** As some Societies split their dance genres and run large Competitions with different Judges and/or at different times of the year, they will be able to nominate more than one Troupe to represent their Society.

** If a Society has 10 or more Troupes that enter and compete for a Troupe Nomination, then they are entitled to offer an additional Nomination. This applies to every multiple of 10 Troupes that enter and compete for a Troupe Nomination. Therefore – 1-9 Troupes = 1 Nomination

10 Troupes = 1 additional Nomination 20 Troupes = 2 additional Nominations 30 Troupes = 3 additional Nominations 40 Troupes = 4 additional Nominations
